

The advent spirit of waiting and longing for the Lord reminds us of the daily call to holiness. We are to be found blameless when He comes, living lives of honesty and integrity. We are to avoid the temptations of escapism from the



true meaning of life. The temptations come in many guises.

The Advent Wreath

Advent Candles shine brightly in the midst of darkness symbolizing and reminding us that Jesus came as light into our dark world. The Advent wreath tradition involves four candles around the ever-green wreath. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas. Each candle represents something different, the first, second and fourth candles are purple; the third candle is rose-coloured. The first candle symbolizes hope and is called the "Prophet's Candle" The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.

It's a lovely little booklet of prayers for every day of Advent.


SUNDAY 8th /9th December
